Students have the task of designing a new

currency that meets the economic needs of the entire world community. They'll talk about the role of money and look at samples from countries around the world, choosing what important images and information should be included in the design. They'll also make a special wallet for their newly minted currency. Grades 2-8.

## Birds of a Feather

Kentucky artist John James Audubon filled countless pages with his drawings of both birds and animals in the natural setting of a new

frontier. Students will sharpen their drawing skills to fill a take-home book with Audubon-like creatures in their natural habitat. Grades 2-5.
