Capturing Light and Life: The Art of Mildred Colvin. This exhibit features the art of Mildred Colvin, a largely self-taught artist who lived in Greensburg, Kentucky. She began painting seriously as an adult in the 1950's. With a career spanning five decades, Mrs. Colvin collected a long list of awards and honors that recognized her achievements. A charter member of the Kentucky Watercolor Society, Mrs. Colvin became a Signature Member of the organization in 2002 and won the People's Choice Award that year for her painting "Shelling on Sanibel." Mrs.

Colvin passed away in 2005 in Greensburg, Kentucky. The exhibit will be on display through August 31, 2015. Sponsored by Colvin Frame Shop.



Claysville & Ruckerville: Historically Black Neighborhoods in Paris, Kentucky. Claysville and Ruckerville sprang up following the Civil War as communities for freed slaves. 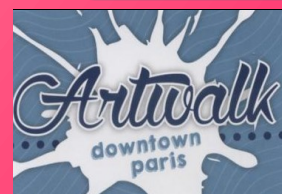
