The Junior Class with its ambitious students began the 1950-51 season with the high school get to gether including a supper in the school cafeteria followed by a party of games and square dancing.


With the on-coming of the basket-ball season the Juniors took part in rearing two cheerleadersand eight players, four ranking the "A" squad.


SOPHOMORES
