He attended public schools of Virginia, graduating from Clifton Forge H.S., in Clifton Forge, Virginia. From there he went to Lynchburg College where he received his B.A. degree and did one year of graduate work in the University of Virginia in the field of History. He taught and coached at the Randolph Macon Academy, Front Royal, Virginia, for 8 years.

After the war he went with the YMCA and served as Physical Director and General Secretary at Daytona Beach, Florida, until May, 1953, at which time he came to Millersburg as the third superintendent of M.M.I.
