



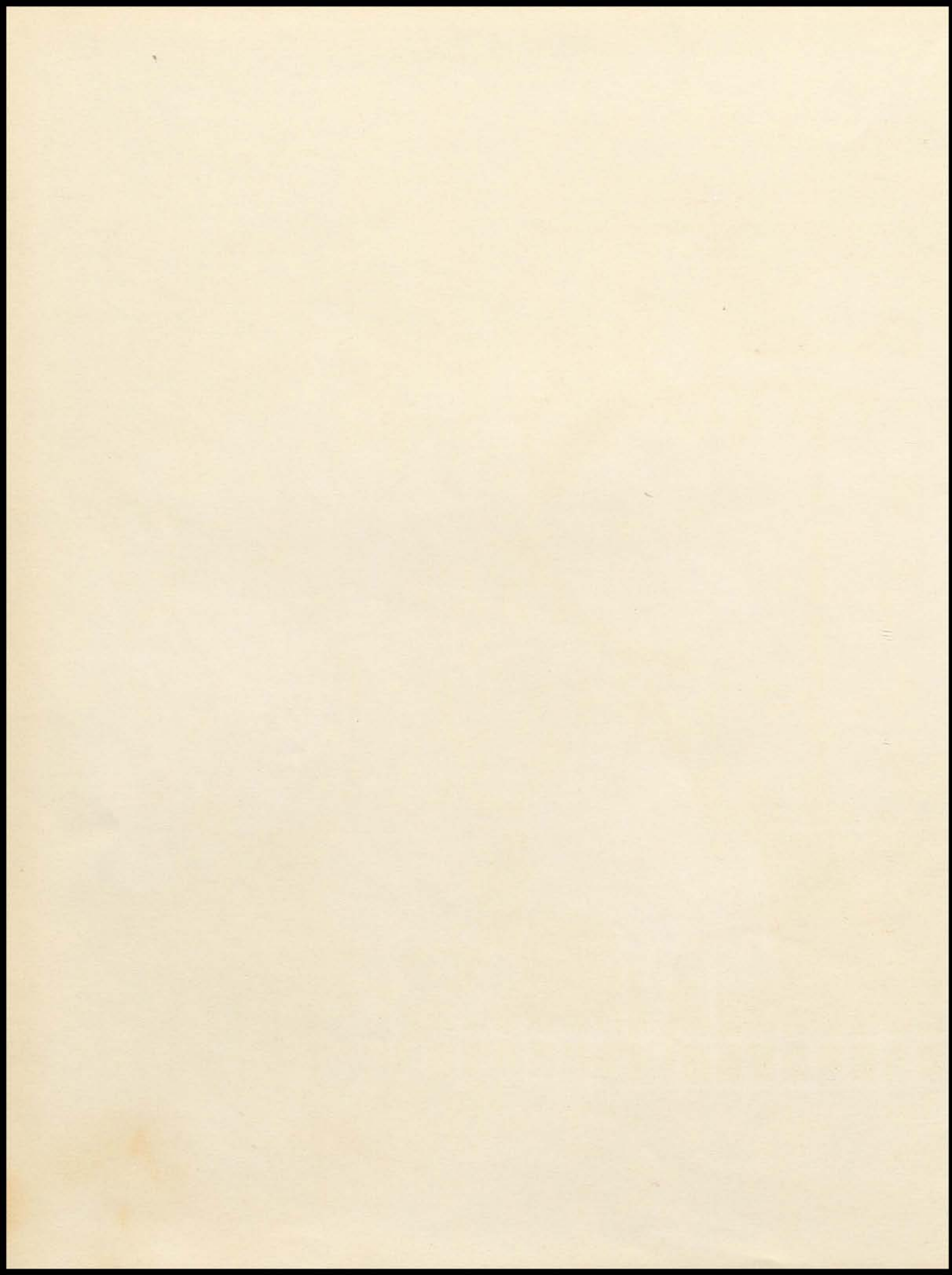

And their good times.

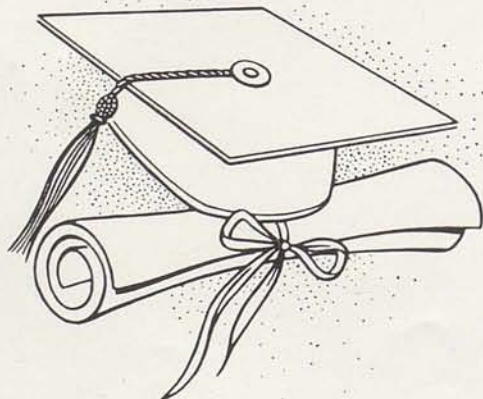

We'll never know.

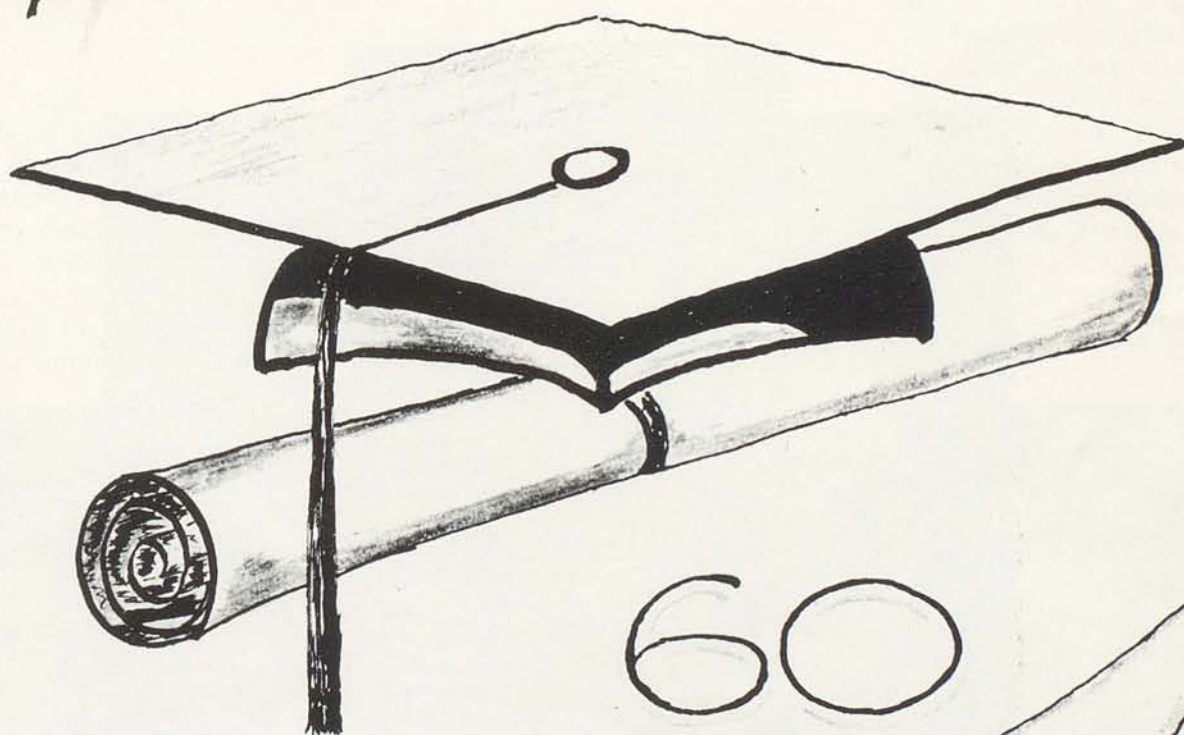
