French and Spanish Club



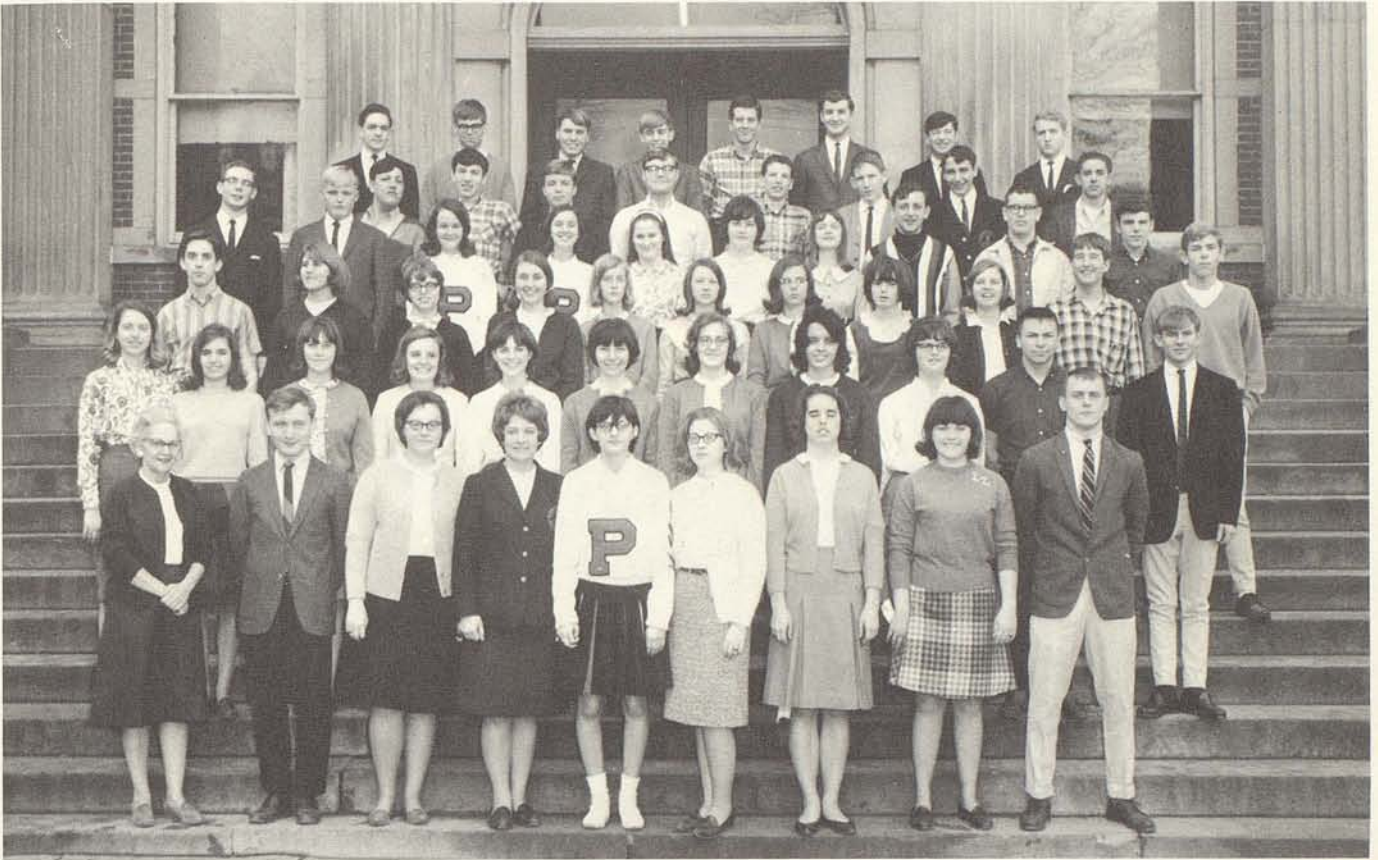

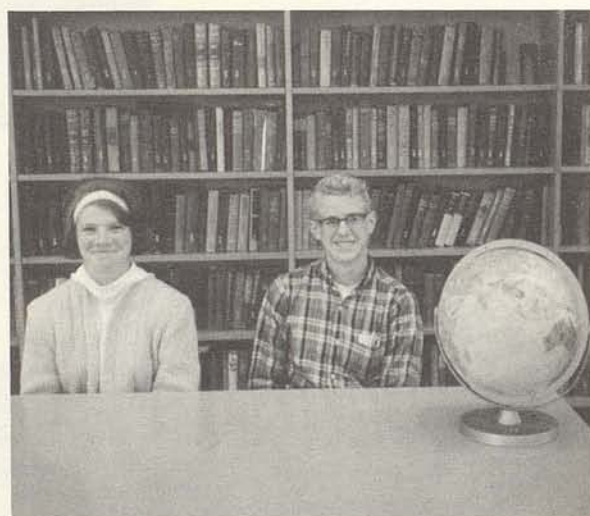
In recognition of her twelve years of remarkable attendance, Bethany Williams was presented an award for her loyalty, courage, and her ability to keep going in spite of many handicaps.
