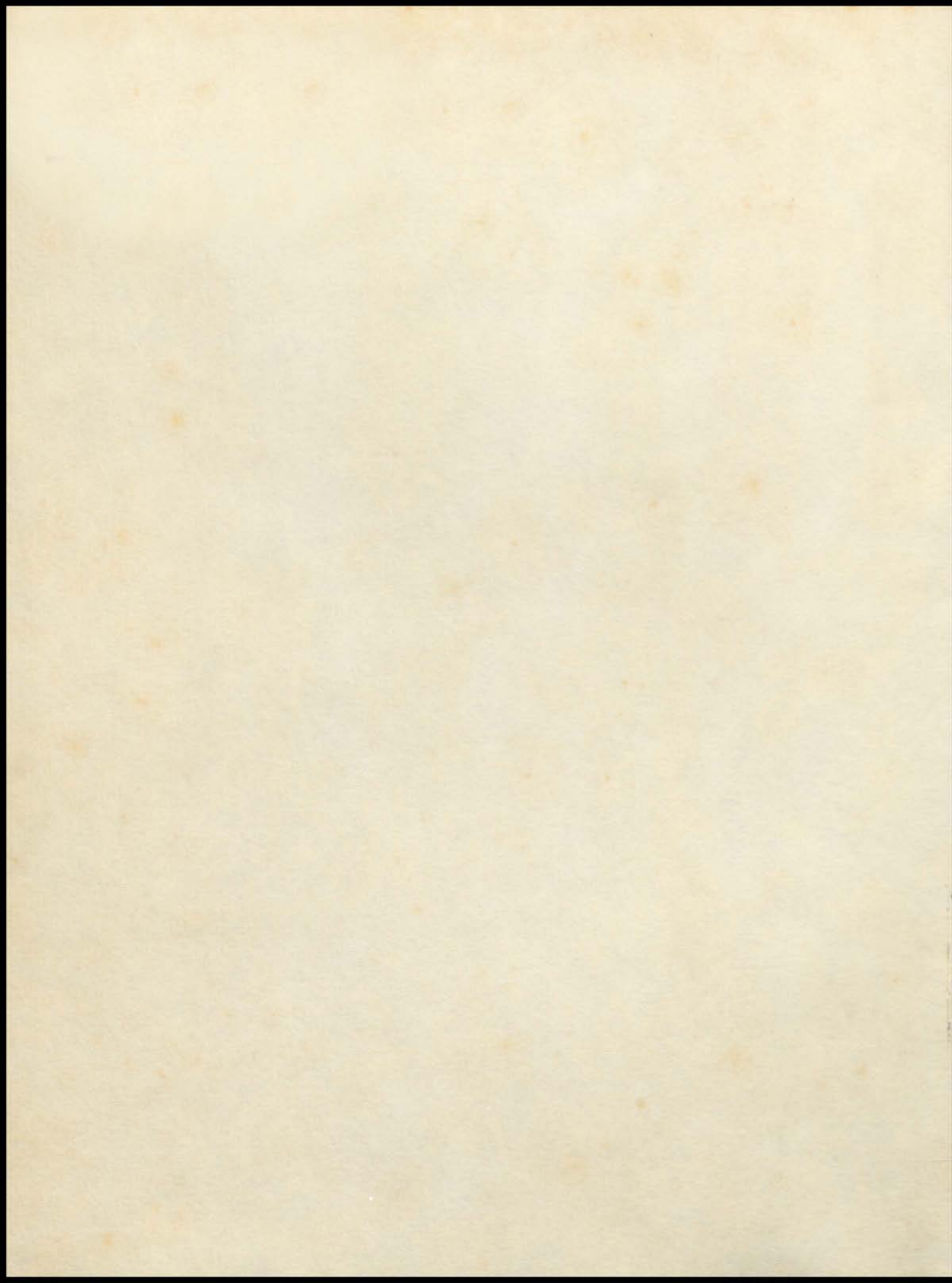

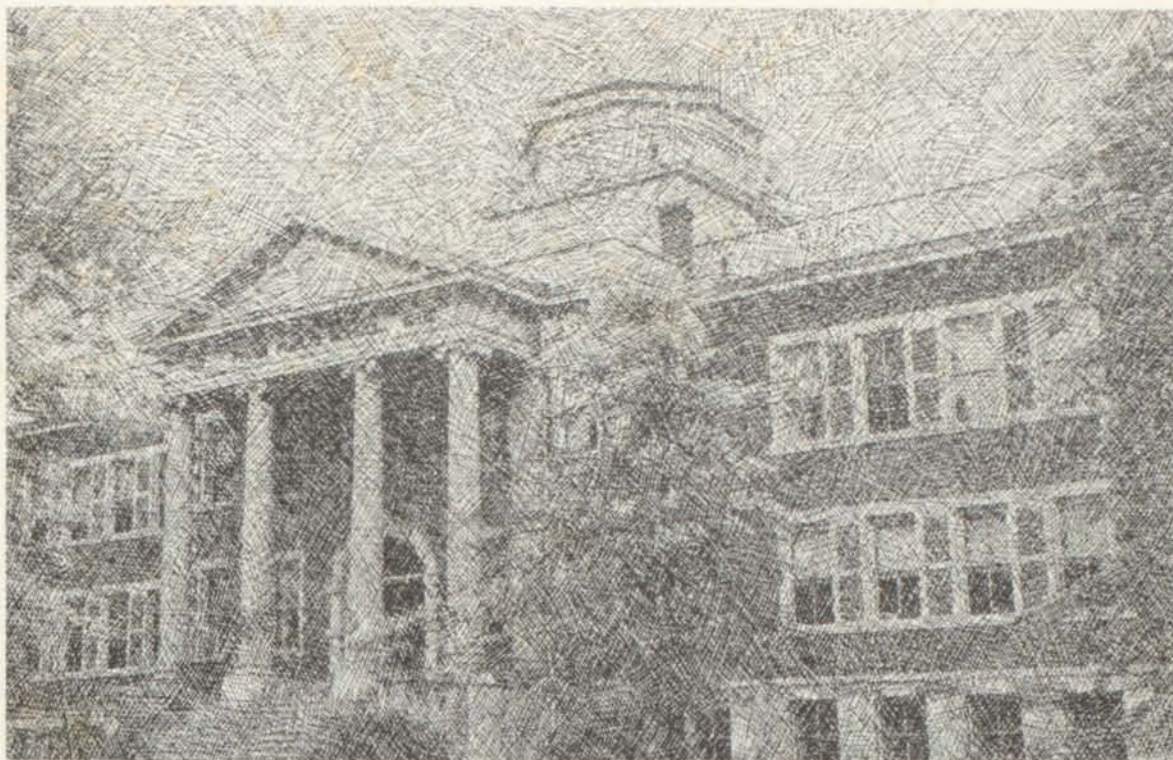


Mrs. Clay Roseberry
