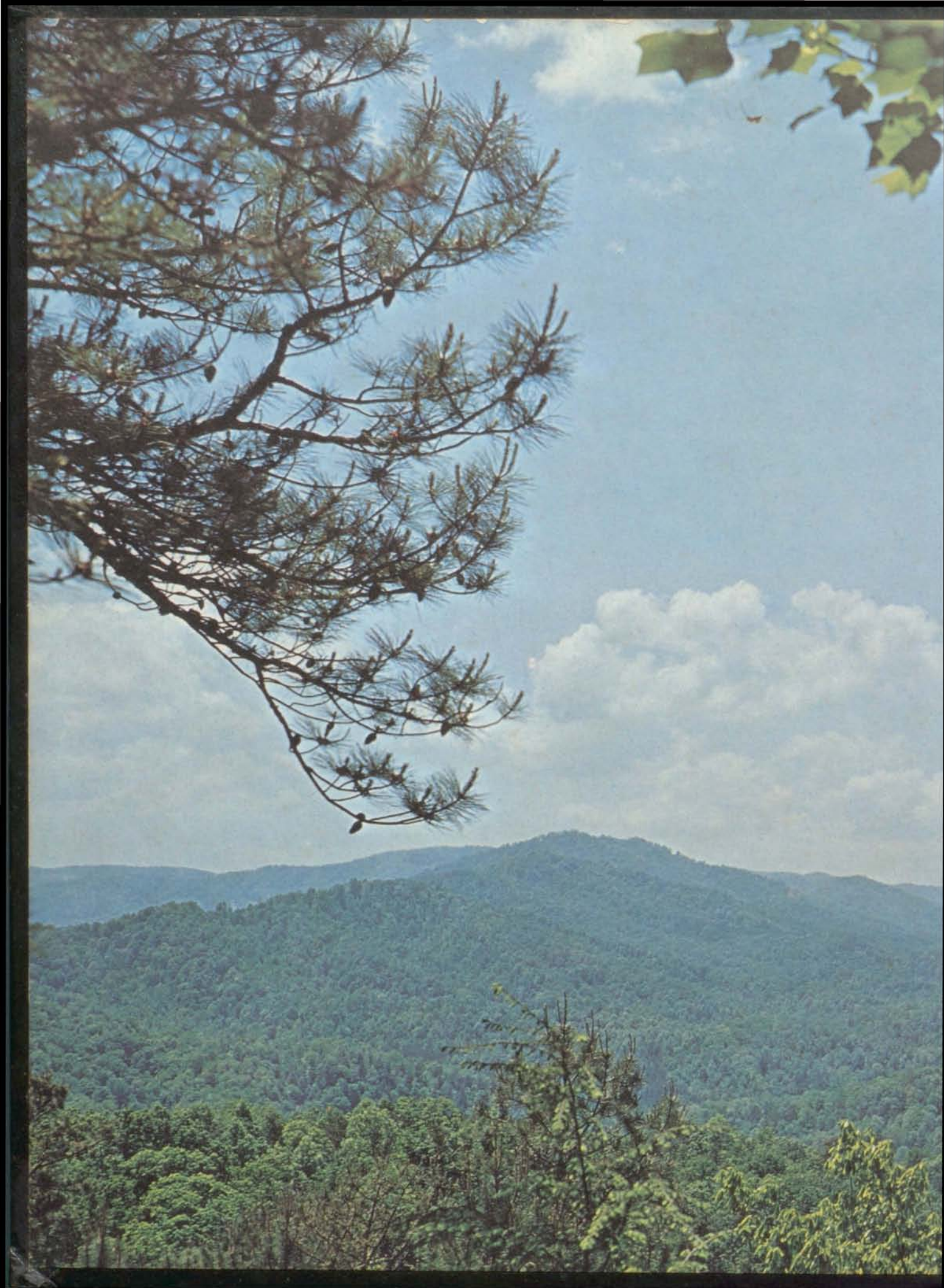
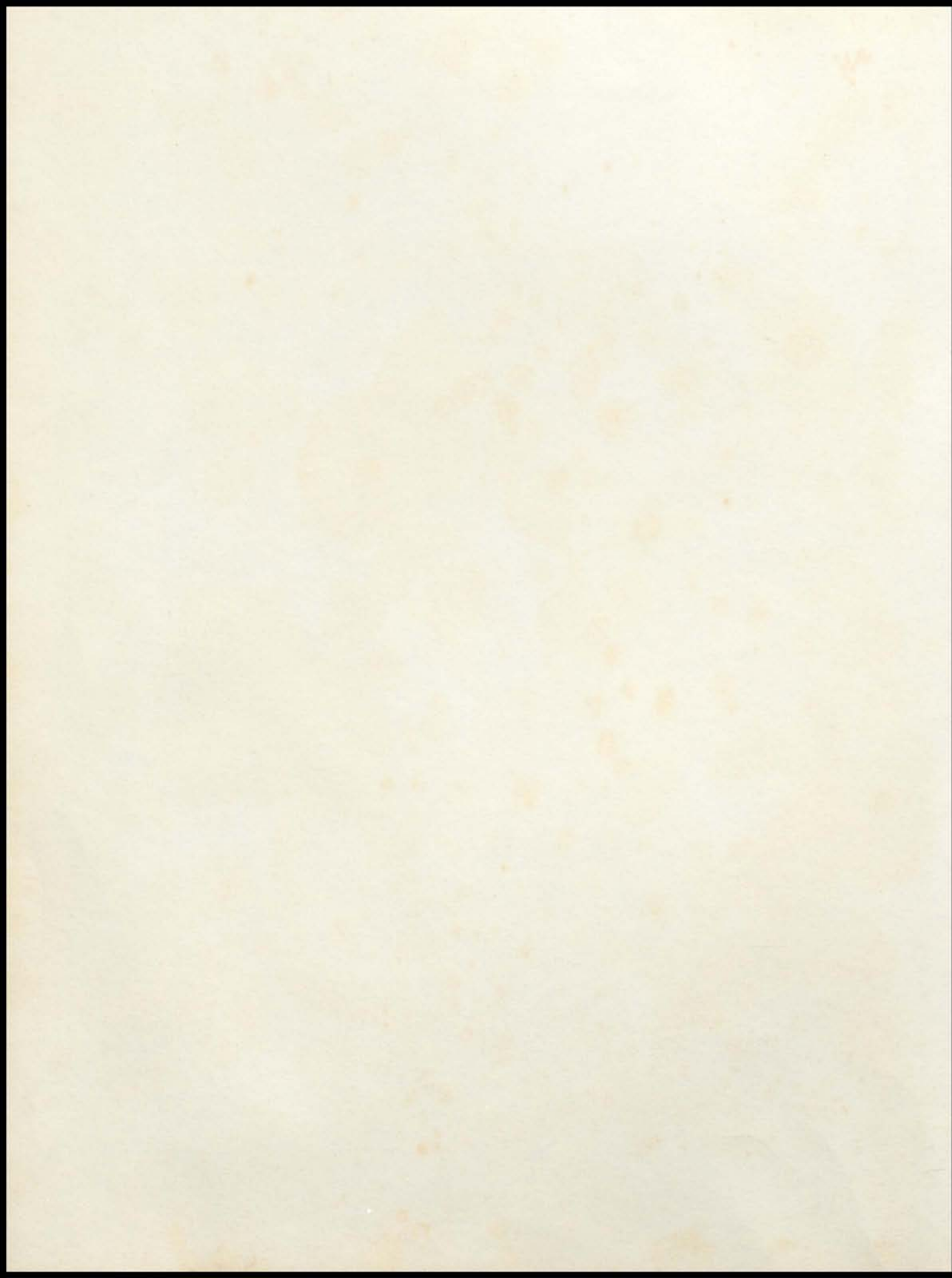

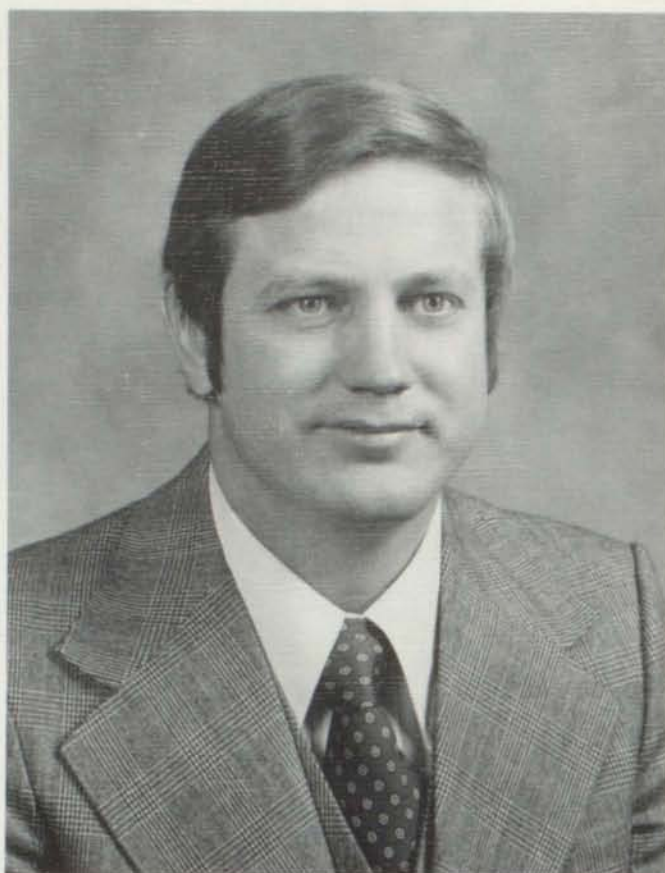

 your life?

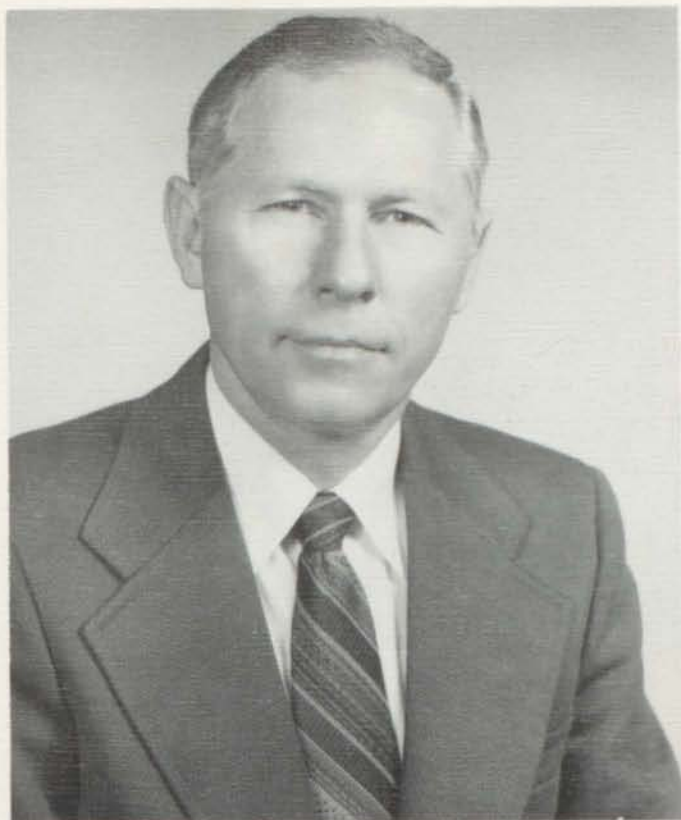
Reach out for the joy and the sorrow

This group was under the direction of Mr. Thomas A. Siwicki. Thanks, Parisonnaires, for bringing a little music into everyones lives!

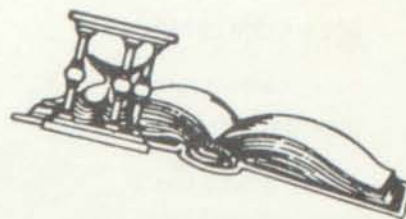

Although the Greyhounds did not fare well in the State Competition the season can be considered a great success.





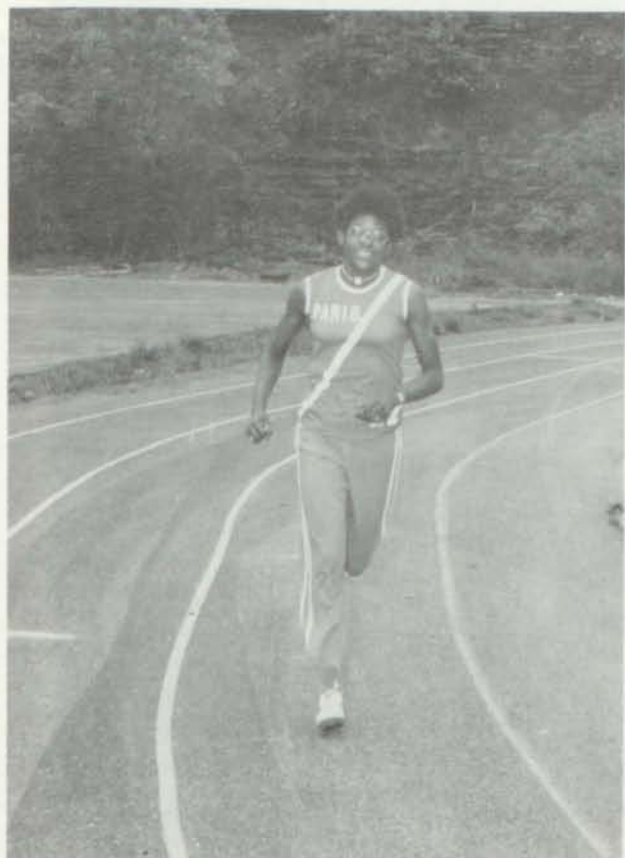

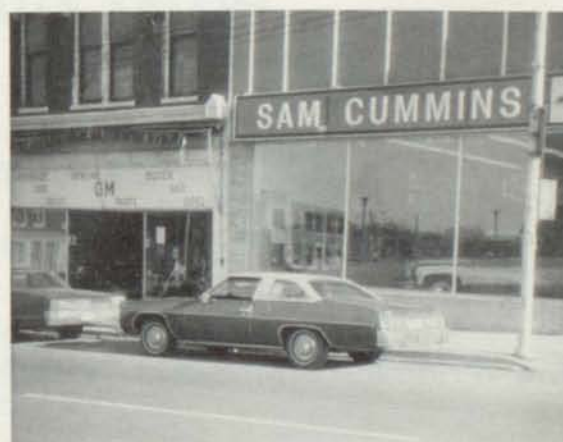

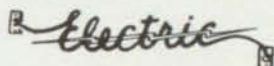
