This group was under the direction of Mr. Thomas A. Siwicki. Thanks, Parisonnaires, for bringing a little music into everyones lives!





ment at the University of Kentucky.


The Club members were recipients of many awards for their art projects during the year. They also helped decorate our community at Christmas by painting a nativity scene on the window of one of our downtown merchants.


#### Track Team Captures Regional
