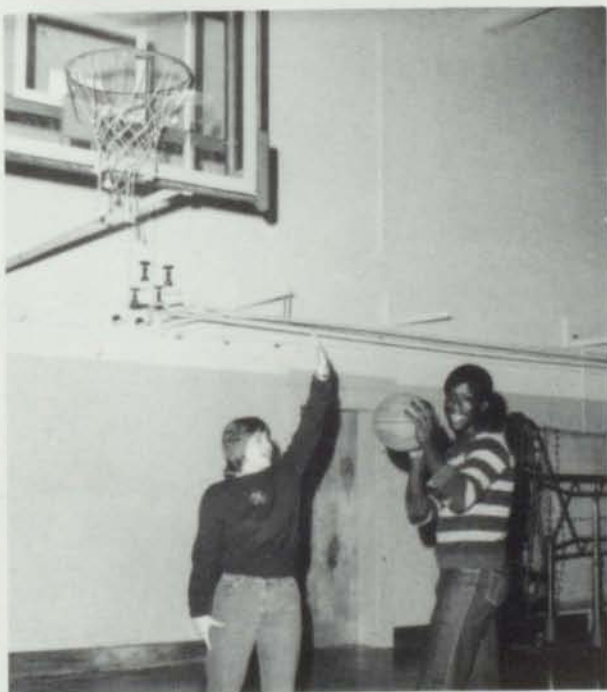
### *Most Talented* *Ruthie Shriver* *Rene Zuniga*

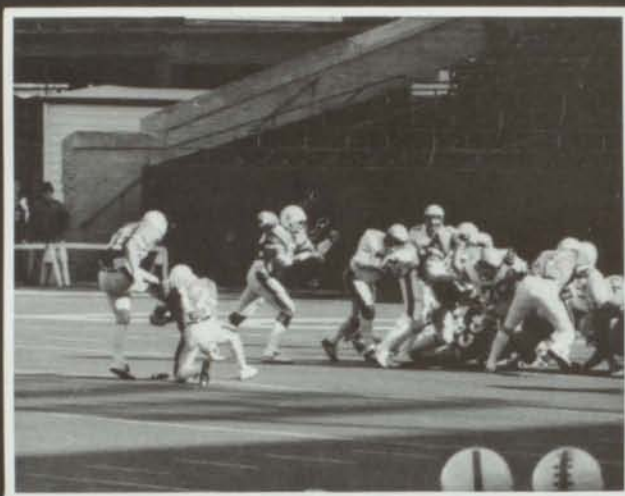

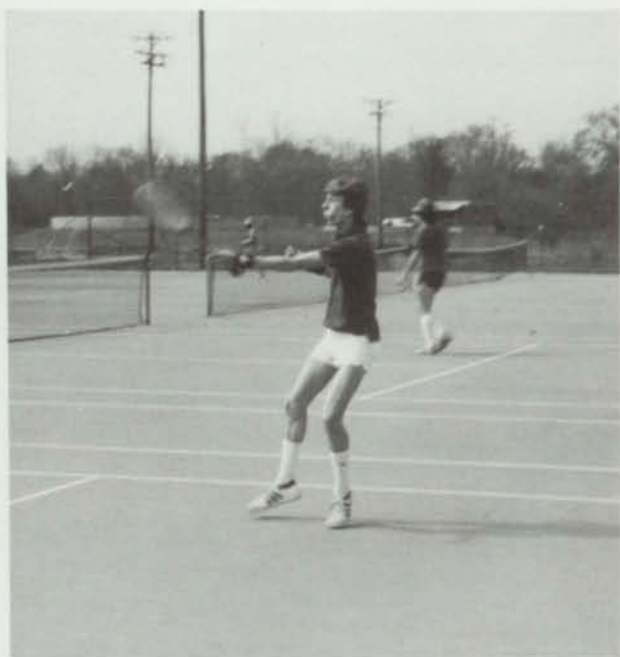

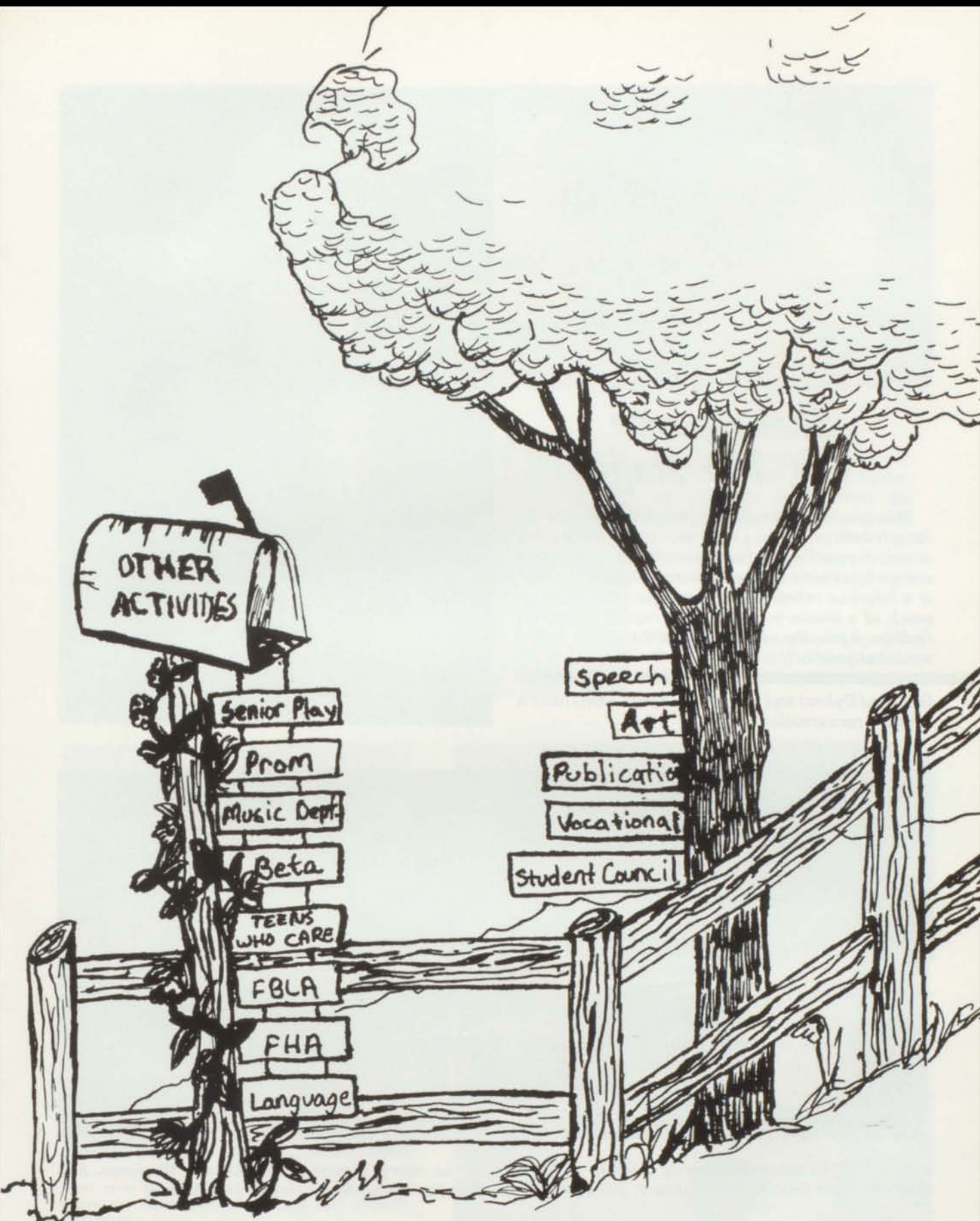

They had a Christmas Party with members of the FHA. Also at Christmas time, food was given to the Food Storage Project in Paris which went to needy families.

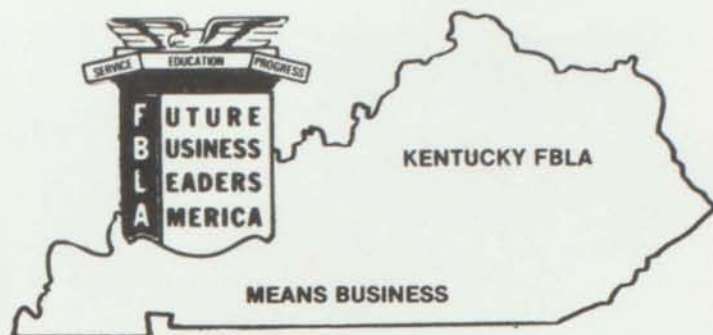

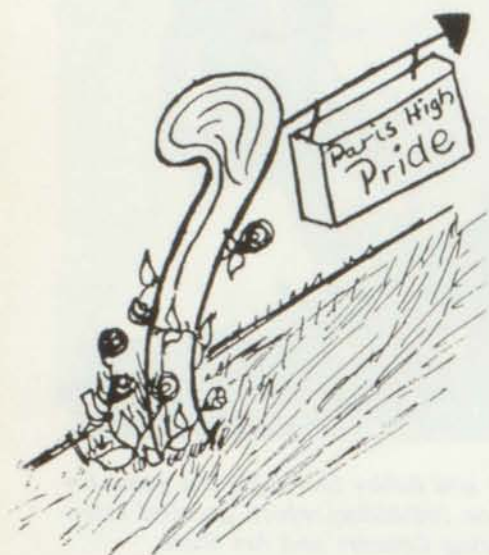

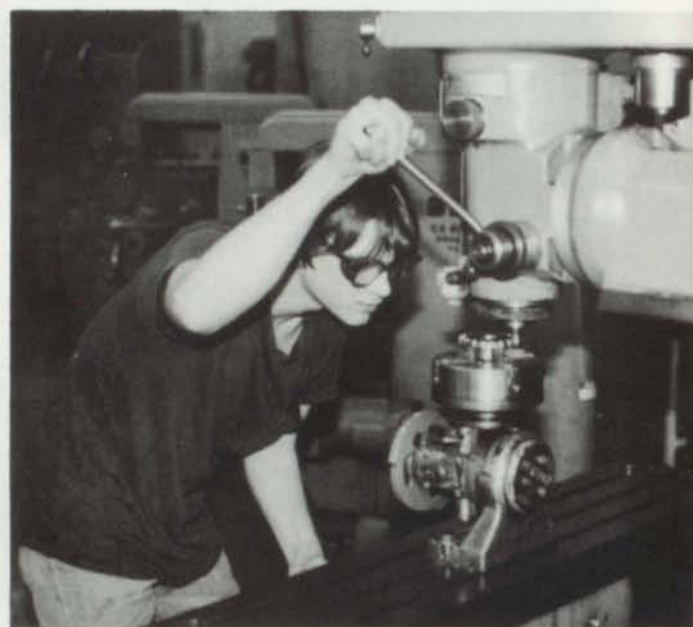
