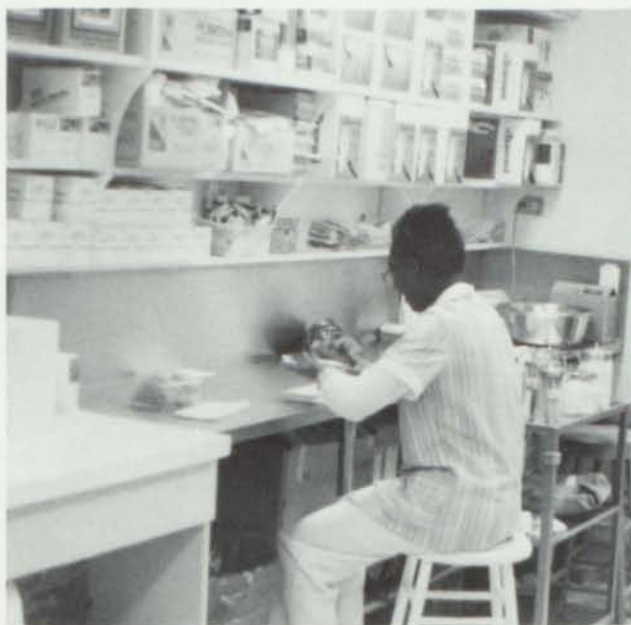

## IN MEMORIAM

A legendary figure of Paris, Blanton L. Collier, was taken from us on March 22, 1983.

A native of Millersburg, he moved to Paris when he was six. He became a star athlete at Paris, graduated in the class of 1923 and returned as a coach and teacher in 1927.

His football teams won or shared two Central Kentucky Conference titles. His basketball teams went to the State Tournament four times.

He left Paris in 1943 for active duty in the Navy. In 1946, he joined the Cleveland Browns as an assistant coach. He became head football coach at U.K. in 1954 and in eight years posted a 41-36 record. He returned to the Browns as head coach directing them to the NFL title game three times and winning the Championship in 1964. Upon his retirement, he moved to Houston, Texas.

He was a very special man to every one who knew him. At the age of 76, he was brought home, to be buried in the Paris Cemetery.

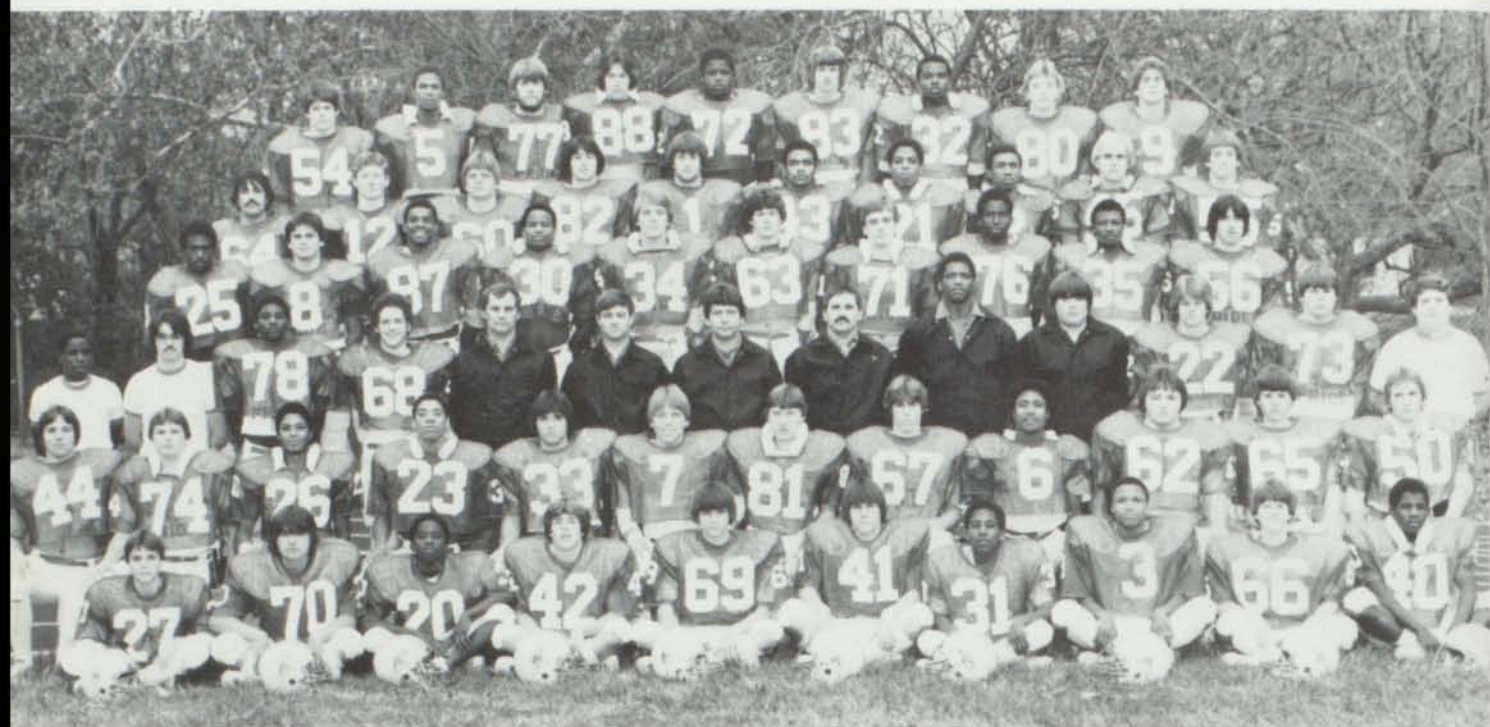

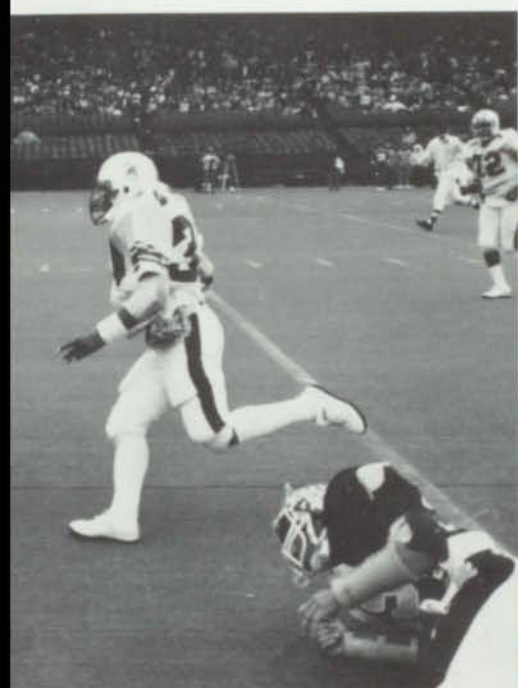
