
Seniors Say Goodbye

In her spare time she enjoys swimming, reading, composing poetry and spending time with her family.







first half of the school year.





A New Club On Campus








Win Or Lose, They Cheer










They breezed past their first opponent in the district tourney only to lose a heart breaker to Harrison County in the championship game. The final margin being only two points.






Swinging Into Spring


