“They’re cadets”

MILLERSBURG — Millersburg Military Institute's all-male tradition ended in 1978 when the school in Bourbon County admitted its first female cadets.

Last month, in another departure from tradition, senior Rose Mary Stamler became the first young woman to receive the Douglas MacArthur Award as the institute's outstanding cadet.

Rose Mary, 17, thus moved to the forefront of the school's 100 cadets — which includes seven other women.

Times are changing at the state's only surviving military academy.

“The girls do very well. They are very conscientious in class,” said Linda Linville, the school's guidance counselor.

Superintendent Alan Saunders said the institute followed the lead of the U.S. service academies in admitting females. But the decision also was aimed

at increasing enrollment at the institute, which opened in 1893.

“Boys were not coming,” Saunders said last week. “Boys want to be where girls are.”

All of the young women attending the institute said they came to the school for academics.

Heather Mathes, 15, who began attending MMI in January, said classes at her high school had 35 to 40 students. Classes at MMI have about six students, which gives her more individual attention, she said.

“It's a better school,” she said.

“The classes are not only smaller, but the teachers are more concerned,” said Sarah Harris, 14.

The girls have done well academically at the school, Saunders said, noting that their work is equal or superior to that of the boys.

They also have performed well militarily. In addition to Rose Mary's award, Jo Brady, 15, is an expert in riflery and Stacy Seligman, also 15, is a sharpshooter.

The girls are day students because there are no barracks for them. All the young women live at home except Stacy, who is from Fort Mitchell and lives with a local family.

Because they don't live on campus, they are not subject to reveille in the morning, but the military exercises cannot be ignored.

Training is rigorous, they said, but not impossible.

"It was a goal for me," Stacy said. "I didn't know if I could stand the drilling."

The cadets' schedule includes drilling, two formations each day, classes, individual sessions with teachers and an activities session.

MMI, which is accredited by the Kentucky Department of Education, enrolls students in grades 7 through 12 and has 17 faculty members. It caters to those with academic and leadership potential, said Ms. Linville. Tuition is \$5,700 a year.

The school has had a 25 percent increase in enrollment over the past two years, she said.

"Vietnam hurt all the military schools," she said. "We're just getting out of that trend."

And MMI strongly adheres to a military tradition. Cadets sign an honor code upon enrolling, in which they pledge not to lie, steal or cheat.

The girls said they are expected to stick to the same military standards as the boys. Mistakes mean demerits. The punishment can be push-ups, walking, shoveling coal or mopping the mess hall.

But a few boys said the girls are treated with deference.

"They're pampered," said Keith Stewart, 16. "All the teachers think, 'Oh, they're girls.'"

When the boys drop a rifle in drill, they have to do push-ups, he said. If the girls drop a rifle, they have to do push-ups, but if they can't they are allowed to get up, he said.

Still, several administrators and some of the girls said there is more equality between the sexes at MMI than at other high schools.

"We don't pay any attention," said Capt. Ed Bacon, who lives on campus and oversees the boys' barracks. "They're cadets."

"The boy-girl relationship is much more natural," Saunders said. Boys and girls wear Army fatigues, he said.

"The uniform is an advantage because you don't have to worry about what you're going to wear," Sarah Harris said.

But sometimes the cadets do get teased about their attire. Last year at a National Honor Society convention in Louisville, MMI students were jeered because of their dress. But when Rose Mary Stamler gave a speech about the meaning of each award on her uniform, she received a standing ovation.

"Somebody has to be set straight," she said. "What people don't understand, they criticize."

Rose Mary doesn't plan a career in the military, she said, and doesn't think women should be on the front lines. She will attend Centre College next fall to study business and economics.

In fact, none of the girls said she aspired to a military career. But Amy Dohn, 12, said her father had his own ideas.

"My father wants me to be an Air Force pilot," she said.

The girls said they don't miss much that other schools may offer.

"We have dances and parties and proms," Rose Mary said.

And after attending a predominantly male school for so many years, she said, she doesn't see why girls make a "big fuss" over boys.

Still, the chain of command may change things a little bit. Rose Mary and Kim Shannon, 16, are dating cadets of higher rank and must obey their orders. And the girls must salute. The two said they tried to separate school and dating.

As rank has its privileges, so can it have disadvantages, the girls have found.

"It's hard when the girl has a higher rank than her boyfriend," Amy said.

"You feel really helpless when you give a guy an order, and he doesn't do it," said Dana Hyatt, 14.

"Especially if he is bigger and taller," Jo Brady added.

The girls said they are not subject to any more teasing than any other new cadets.

"Everybody gets their share of teasing," said Jim Childs, 15.

But the boys have to be careful about what they say because the girls stick together.

"If they said something bad about one of us, they said it about all of us," Heather said.

On the whole, though, the boys and the girls get along well.

"The boys up here are just as good of friends as girls are," Dana said.

Chad Seligman, 13, Stacy's brother, said he didn't mind having girls at MMI because "nobody flirts with the girls."

Having girls at MMI is an advantage "so you have someone to take to dances," Jim said. "Most don't mind it at all."

The eight girls at MMI say they have enough boys to handle. And they enjoy it.

"It's like having a hundred brothers," Heather said.

Millersburg Military Institute Honored in 91st Year

On Monday, March 27, 1984 Governor Martha Layne Collins signed House Joint Resolution No. 20 of the General Assembly, Commonwealth of Kentucky designating Millersburg Military Institute as the official military institute of the Commonwealth. The resolution also empowered the Governor to sign diplomas of the future graduates of Millersburg Military Institute.

The General Assembly Resolution stated as follows:

"A JOINT RESOLUTION designating Millersburg Military Institute as the military school of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and empowering the Governor to sign its diplomas.

WHEREAS, Millersburg Military Institute, since 1893, has served the Commonwealth and the nation by preparing young men and women for life and leadership roles consistent with the highest standards of education; and

WHEREAS, the effectiveness of Millersburg Military Institute is illustrated by the alumni who have become leaders in business, education, government, the military and the many other vocations they have pursued; and

WHEREAS, Millersburg Military Institute has maintained its educational quality through periods of economic stress and social change and has begun its tenth decade with a renewed dedication toward academic excellence;

NOW THEREFORE,

Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

Section 1. That the General Assembly recognize Millersburg Military Institute for its many years of valuable service to the youth of Kentucky by designating it the official military institute of the Commonwealth and bestowing upon it all privileges due such honor.

Section 2. That the Governor be empowered to sign diplomas of the future graduates of Millersburg Military Institute and that he be encouraged to do so upon request of the officials of the Institute."

This resolution honors MMI in its 91st year of continuous operation. Millersburg Military Institute is the only military college-preparatory school in the state of Kentucky. It is a non-profit, co-educational institution governed by a Board of Trustees who actively participate in preserving the ideals of education and citizenship. Since its foundation in 1893, MMI has adhered to a tradition of excellence in academic and leadership training. It has served students from throughout the United States and several foreign countries. Many of MMI's graduates hold positions of responsibility in various professions throughout the world.

Graduation is 13 May 1984 and those graduates will receive the first diplomas signed by the Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

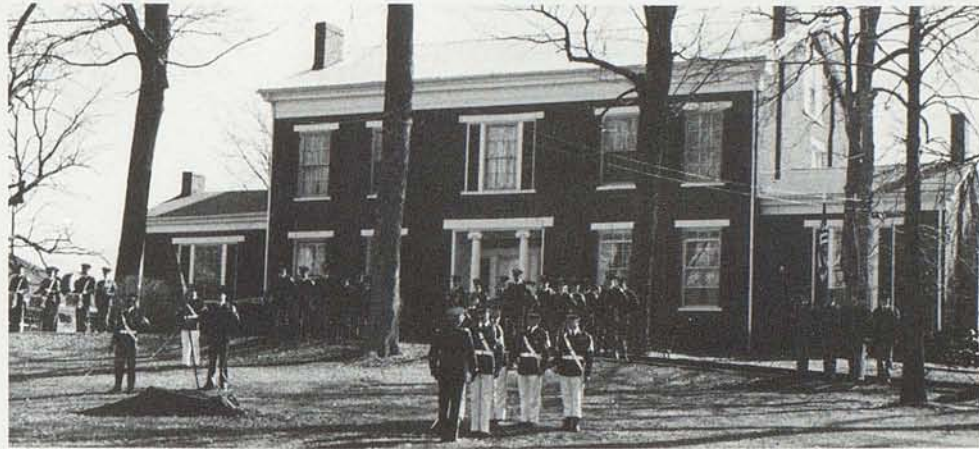

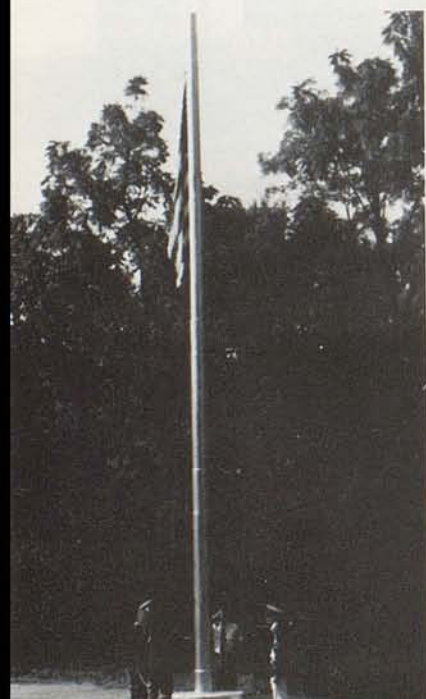

CADETS PARTICIPATE IN YOUTH NEWS PROGRAM

A natural pride of many Kentuckians, a loyal Alma Mater to men and women from all walks of life--such is the story of Millersburg Military Institute.

For ninety-one years, MMI has been an integral part of Millersburg.

In 1893, after Kentucky Wesleyan College had moved to Winchester, Mr. and Mrs. Carl Meade Best, natives of Virginia, came through Millersburg. They were interested in what they saw, obtained the building and the grounds from the Methodist Church Conference and opened Millersburg Training School, across the street from the present location.

The buildings were in a bad state of repair. In 1898, boarding students were first accepted and the school's name was changed to Millersburg Military Institute.

During that summer, interested citizenry of Millersburg and Bourbon County held a public barbecue to raise funds to help buy uniforms, swords, and rifles for 17 enrolled.

From then until the spring of 1920 Col. Best sold the buildings and the grounds to the Bourbon County Board of Education for a high school.

Seven Millersburg citizens, determined MMI would not die, formed a stock company, issued shares and in 1921 purchased "Forest Hill", With "Forest Hill" as a nucleus, it was proposed that MMI be developed into one of the finest preparatory schools in the south. The new school opened in the fall of 1921.

In 1931, the MMI Board of Trustees bought the Millersburg Female College, three blocks from the senior school and established the MMI Junior School Division.

In July of 1948, the United States 55c Reserve Officers Training Corps program was installed. The first female cadets were admitted in January of 1977.

During these years, MMI has worked not only toward scholarship and military proficiency, but has participated in sports, music, and speech. The Cadets have won honors in all these areas.

Now, 1984 sees Millersburg Military Institute continuing to adhere to a tradition and leadership training. It is the goal of MMI's staff and faculty to develop the cadets of today into the successful, self-disciplined, confident and responsible citizens of tomorrow.

- 1893 Col. and Mrs. C. M. Best founded Millersburg Training School in buildings of Kentucky Wesleyan College.
 1898 Became Millersburg Military Institute with the motto "Right Training Is Better Than Riches".
 1920 Col. Best sold property to Bourbon County Board of Education.
 1920 Seven citizens formed a stock company to continue MMI and bought "Forest Hill", home of Sanford Allen, built in 1851.
 1921 Moffet Hall erected as dormitory and amory.
 1923 Rankin Hall erected as classrooms, study hall and dormitory.
 1927 State basketball champions. Has had outstanding records in all sports and activities.
 1931 MMI Board bought Millersburg Female College and established MMI Junior School.
 1944 MMI became non-profit with perpetual charter.
 1948 Board installed United States 55c Reserve Officers Training Corps, designated honor school several years.
 1976 15 April, Governor Carroll proclaimed MMI Day.
 1977 MMI went co-educational for day students in January.
 1979 MMI Junior School property sold.
 1983 90th year of operation.
 1984 MMI declared official military school of Kentucky.

MMI has had eight superintendents during its 91 years of operation, several alumni graduates of all service academies and alumni outstanding in various fields of endeavor, i.e. law, medicine, science, business education and government.
