




Council Tackles Student Concerns

They continued to help by working the Honor Board, serving as ushers at graduation, and serving as guides at the open house and at freshman orientation.



France Comes To Room 203


The annual French projects were especially creative this year.

"Business with Class" was the perfect theme for PHS's FBLA club this year. The theme came through with very rewarding and prosperous results.


The FBLA club started off their year with a fund raiser for members to attend both regional and state meetings by selling gummy bears.

Continuing The Tradition Of Winning Hounds Post 7-3 Season




