












## Thank Heaven For Teachers And Staff


#### Student Council Helps Bring About Changes







To raise money for next year, the Chess Team sponsored the Talent Show this year.






## President Ray Excells In Humorous Interpretation

Ten speech students participated in a community service project for the second year. They furnished the voice for the talking Christmas tree at Ken's Super Value.



While meeting on Wednesday nights the group often enjoyed refreshments, Bible study, and numerous athletic competitions.















The Lady Hounds completed an 18-10 season with a 3rd place in Regional action. Three players broke or tied previous school records.






