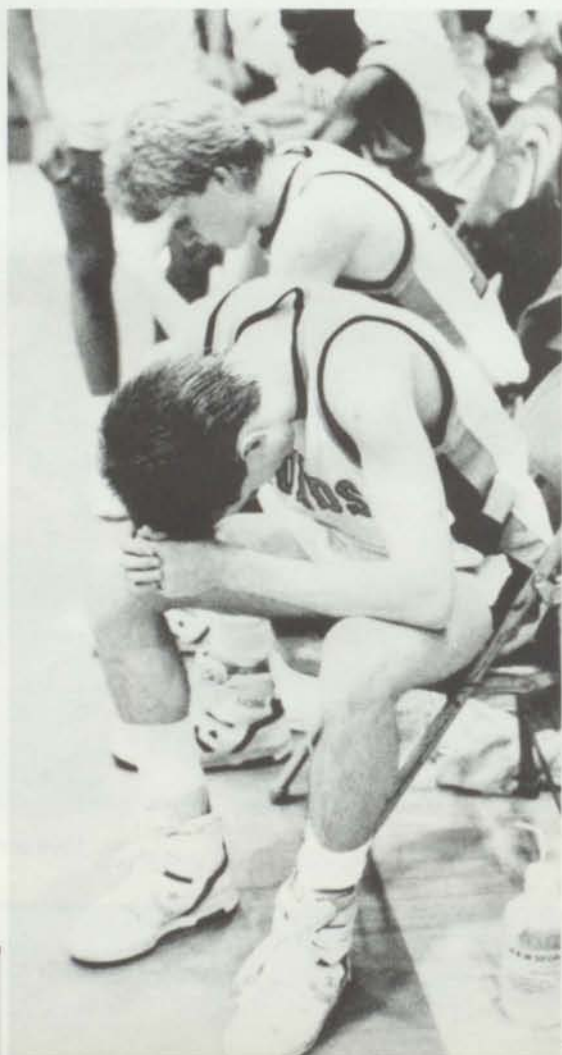

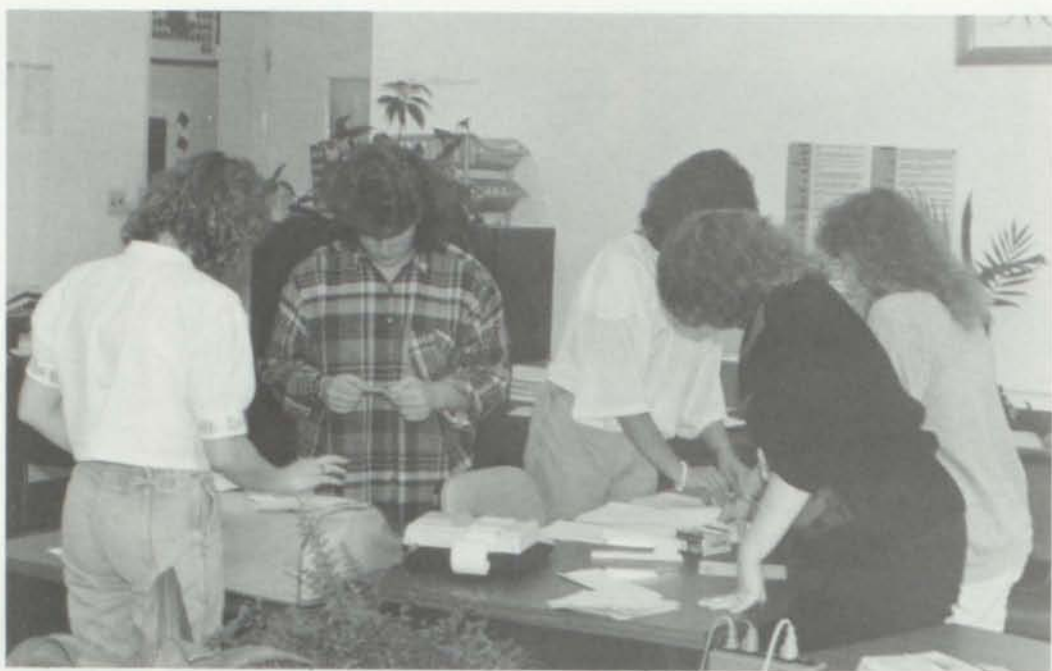

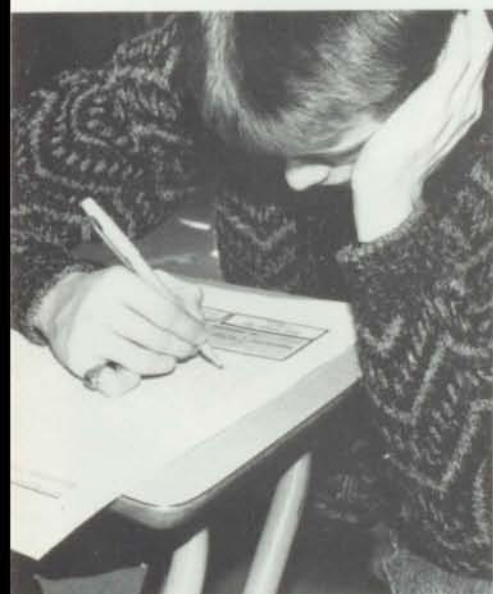

The Beta Club was also responsible for putting the names on the Honor Roll and Faculty List in the front hall.

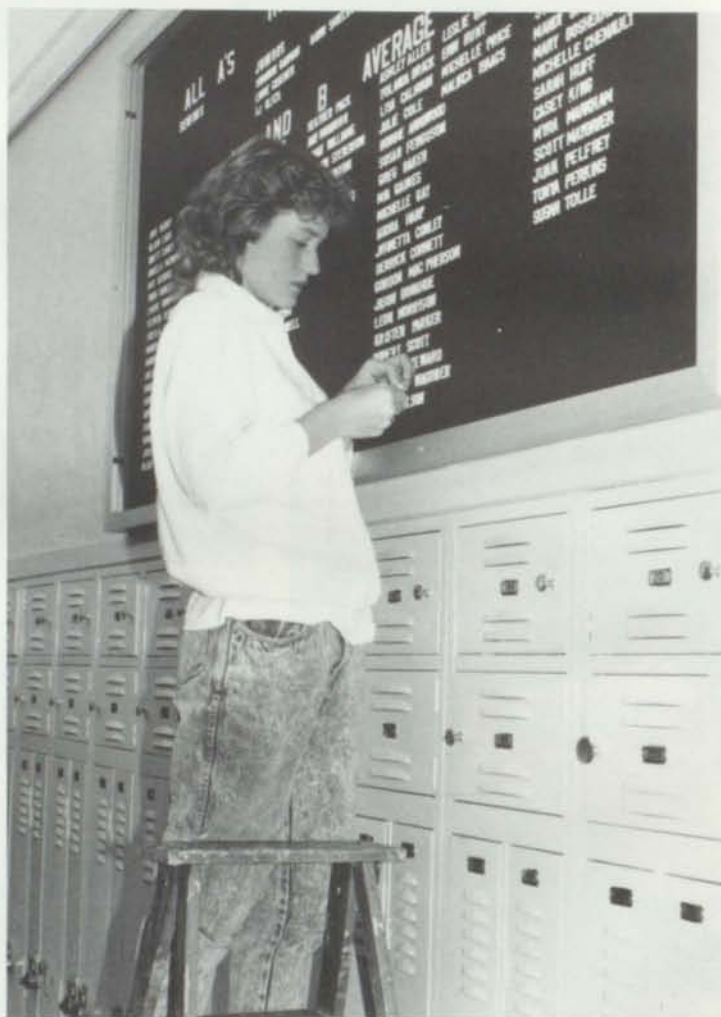

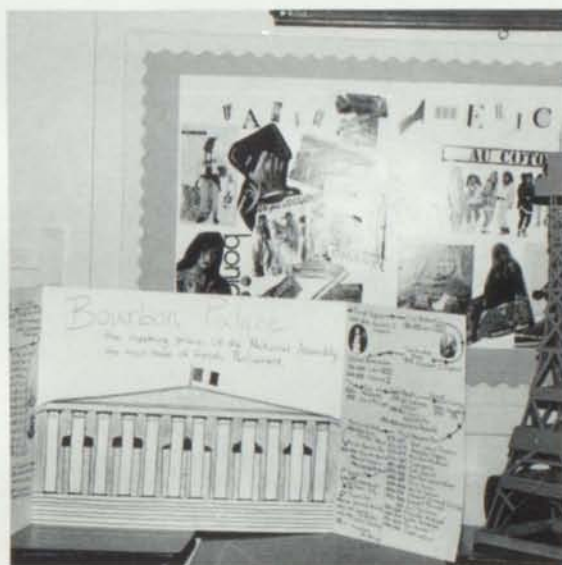

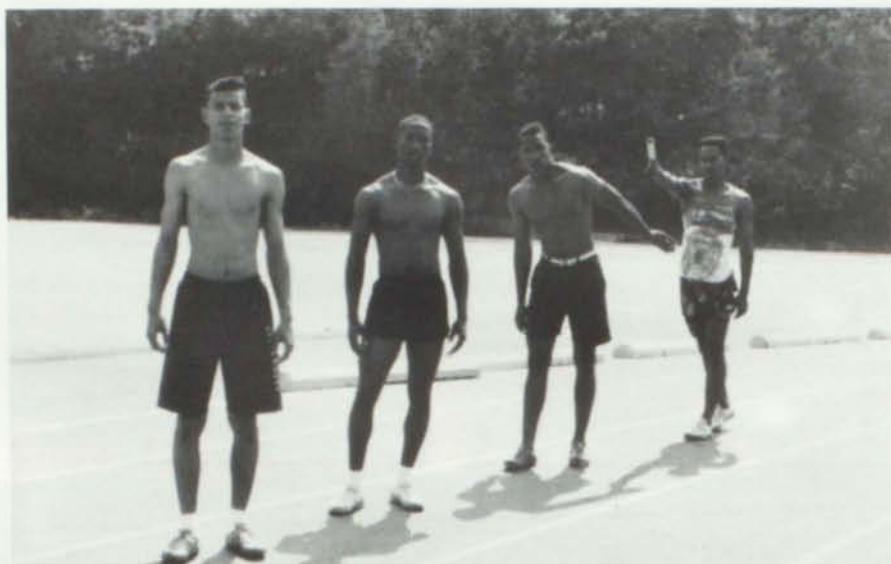

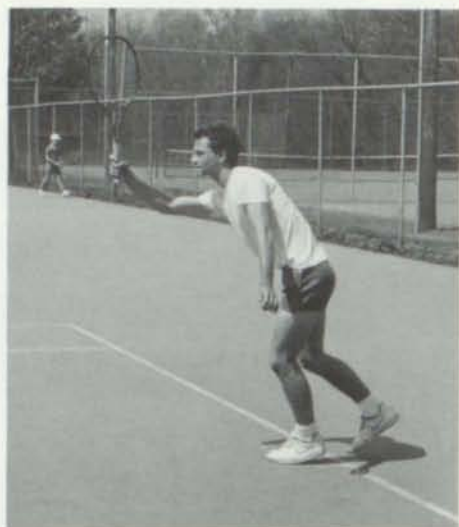

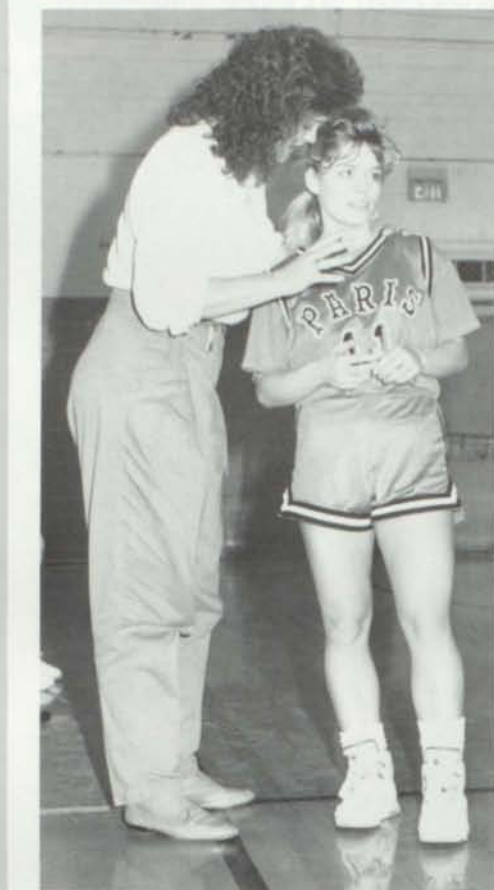

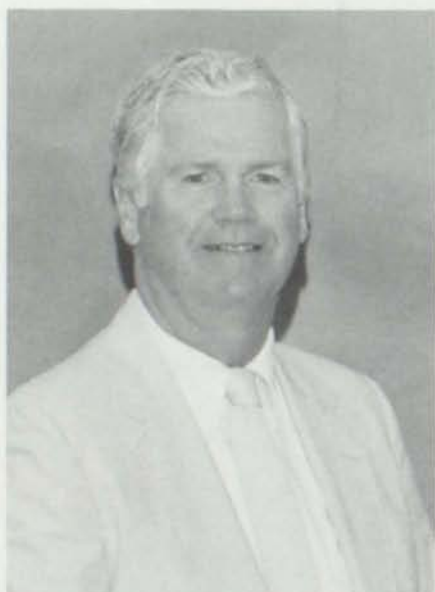
## The Paris Board Of Education Makes Building Plans

Mrs. Mary Dickerson, along with her English classes, does an outstanding job with the newspaper.



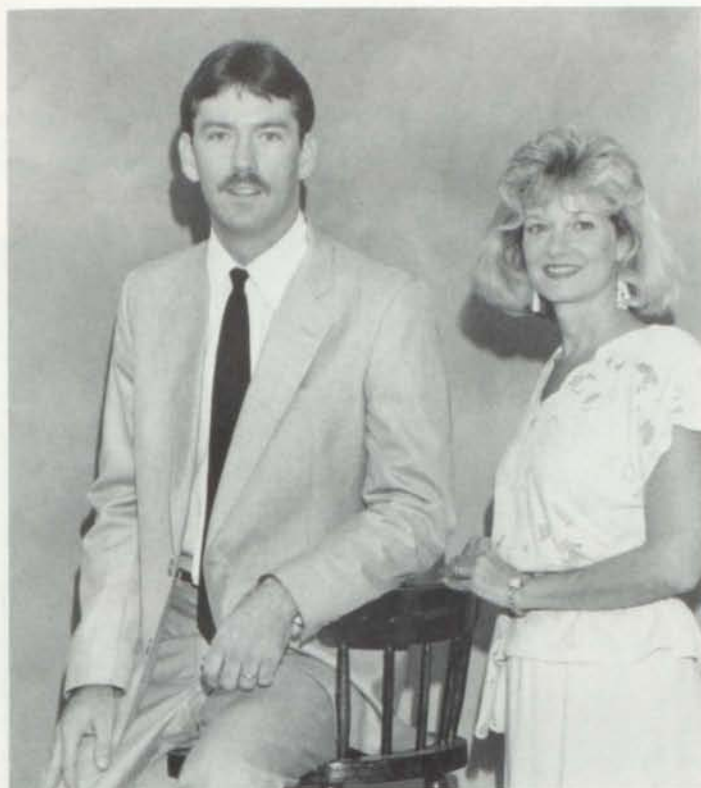
