MAY 22 | EXHIBIT OPENING CROSSROADS: CHANGE IN RURAL AMERICA

The Hopewell Museum is excited to open the Smithsonian Institute Traveling Exhibit, "Crossroads: Change in Rural America" on Saturday, May 22. "**Crossroads** explores how rural American communities changed in the 20th century. From sea to shining sea, the vast majority of the United States landscape remains rural with only 3.5 percent of the landmass considered urban. Since 1900, the percentage of Americans living in rural areas dropped from 60 percent to 17 percent. The exhibit looks at that remarkable societal change and how rural Americans responded."
